OUR MISSION

B-Alternative is a social enterprise that delivers low bono environmental consultancy services. waste reduction strategies and low impact alternatives for everyday products to businesses, schools and events whilst making it financially viable.

FVFNTS

We offer a reusable crockery service that allows the event to eliminate single use packaging, which in turn reduces waste to landfill, therefore reducing costs. Additionally, we implement a number of other initiatives to maximise resource recovery and produce an overall greener event that's easier to implement and affordable for all.

SCHOOLS

Provide eco friendly paper, stationary and office supplies at a competitive price. We also introduce an 'eco-bank' for the school, which allows them to capture 5% of their spendings with us and put it toward an environmental project of their choice. This essentially gives the school a budget for the environment, when often none exists.

HOSPITALITY

Provide an organics removal service and discounted truly compostable take away food packaging.

Throughout financial year 2021-22, B-Alternative worked with many clients in the hospitality, construction, schools and events industry, with the focus of much positive creating as environmental impact as possible.

Through our expertise and passion for environmental sustainability regeneration, we were able to divert large amounts of organic waste from landfill and send it to be composted.

We sourced truly compostable food packaging for clients so they could avoid single use plastics, allowing them to close the loop on waste.

RAINFOREST RESCUE

We donated \$3,257 to Rainforest Rescue which contributed towards the protection of 651 square meters of unprotected Daintree rainforest.





SHUCK DON'T CHUCK PROJECT

B-Alternative partnered with The Nature Conservancy with the future goal of collecting seafood shells, and using them to restore oyster reefs in Port Phillip Bay as part of the Shuck Don't Chuck Project.

B-Alternative will be responsible for the collection of shells and delivery to The Nature Conservancy to be recycled.





CERTIFIED SOCIAL ENTERPRISE

We became a certified social enterprise, providing low-bono consultancy rates, which allows organisations to have access to services they may normally not be able to obtain due to budget restrictions.



Halfcut FUNDRASIER

The B-Alternative team raised \$6,948 and saved 2779 square meters of Daintree rainforest for the HalfCut challenge.

OUR 2021-22 STRATEGY



Throughout financial year 2021-22 we focused on the following, in order to have most impact:

Expanding the number of clients we provide our organics removal service to - This allowed us to divert more kg of organic waste from landfill.

Made our way back into the events scene after a 2 year drought from COVID-19, with more of a focus on providing a reusable service.

Begun consulting for construction clients - Writing environmental reports that showcase their positive impact.

Taking on more organics removal service clients, expanding into the construction industry, and getting back into events allowed us to have more of a positive environmental impact than ever before. It did however come at a cost - We have now had to reassess the financial viability of keeping a large scale organics removal service, in a climate of rapid inflation.

Events have proved to be most financially viable for us to operate as a Social Enterprise. Although we didn't divert as much waste from landfill compared to our organics removal service, we feel there is more opportunity for impact through patron education, targeting very wide and diverse audiences that events attract.



THE FUTURE



FY2022-23 GOALS

In financial year 2022-23 B-Alternative have the following goals and key focuses:

IMPROVED REUSABLE EVENT INFRASTRUCTURE

With an increased demand for our event reusable crockery service, we will undertake the following to meet this demand:

- Purchase a retrofitted truck, with a commercial conveyor belt style dishwashing system. This will enable us to service larger events.
- Purchase a more extensive range of reusable crockery, to cater for a wider number of food vendors and different meals.
- Obtain more signed resource recovery stations, to best inform patrons of where to dispose their waste.

EXPAND SCHOOL IMPACT

Work with Take 3 for the Sea on educating, inspiring, and creating hands on positive environmental change with schools across Australia. We will achieve this by offering our follow up consulting services to schools that Take 3 educate, so we can then have real, measurable impact within schools.

REUSABLES IN HOSPITALITY


Promote and help assist takeaway restaurants join the reusable movement. We will achieve this through upcoming partnerships with reusable takeaway crockery/food container companies.

There is currently a large disconnect between the compostable packaging supply chain, and the end of life recycle/compost facilities.

There is more evidence emerging that compostable food packaging is becoming increasingly difficult to recycle/compost without releasing toxic chemicals into the environment. It is this reason, that we are taking an even greater focus on providing services that support a reusable system. Compostable packaging has been a great transition away from single use plastic, however now the real change and impact lies within supporting a circular economy through reusing and education.
